How Can I Say Thanks? Psalm 116

- Intro: In this psalms of *thanksgiving*, the psalmist proclaims his love for the LORD (vv. 1-2), reflects on Yahweh's gracious and merciful deliverance from certain death (vv. 3-11), and vows to worship Yahweh at His temple as long as he lives (vv. 12-19; cf. v. 2b).
 - I. Proclamation Of His Love For Yahweh vv. 1-2

II. Reflection On His Deliverance By Yahweh vv. 3-11

- A. The report: The peril of certain death (vv. 3, 8)
- B. The plea: *His prayer for deliverance* (v. 4)

"O LORD, I beseech Thee, save my life!"

C. The rescue: Yahweh's gracious deliverance (vv. 5-11)

III. Vow To Offer A Sacrifice of Thanksgiving To Yahweh vv. 12-19

In light of his great deliverance the psalmist asks, *"How can I say thanks to the LORD for all His gracious benefits toward me?"* (v. 12). The psalmist records eight "I will" statements that outline five pledges vowing to serve the LORD all the days of his life. **The five pledges are:**

- 1. "I will call upon Him (the name of the LORD) as long as I live" (vv. 2b, 13b, 17b)
- 2. "I will walk before the LORD, in the land of the living" (v. 9)
- 3. "I will lift up the cup of salvation" (v. 13a; cf. 1 Cor. 10:13)
- 4. "I will pay my vows to the LORD, Oh may it be in the presence of all His people" (vv. 14, 18)
- 5. "I will offer to Thee a sacrifice of thanksgiving" (v. 17a)

Application:

Offering thanksgiving to God is healthy. **Thanksgiving liberates the soul from ingratitude** by allowing a person to thank God for what He has done, and to share with fellow human beings.
