Interpretation:

Jesus' claim to equality with His Father is supported by His miraculous works. The Father has appointed His Son, the Lord Jesus, *to give life to believers* and *to judge unbelievers*.

Applications:

- 1. Jesus works miracles according to His sovereign will; He picks this man out of many.
- 2. One's eternal destiny is more important than one's temporal disability!
- 3. Sin is sometimes the cause of sickness, but not always.
- 4. Genuine gratitude should be demonstrated by holy living (Exod 19:5-6; 1 Pet 2:5, 9)
- 5. Jesus heals the chronic diseases and hurts that plague our souls.
- 6. God enables/empowers us to carry out His commands! Therefore, live to glorify Jesus!!!
