Isaiah 7:14

Intro: Following Adam and Eve's fall into sin God promised to send a Savior to destroy Satan and to deliver man from sin (Gen. 3:15). He later prophesied through Isaiah that the Savior would be born of a virgin-conception (Isaiah 7:14). The New Testament opens with twin accounts of Mary's virgin-conception and birth of the Son of God, the Savior of mankind recorded by Matthew 1:18-25 and Luke 1:26-38 and 2:1-20.
