# Contend Earnestly for the Faith Jude

Intro: Jude, the brother of James, and half-brother of Jesus Christ, writes a scathing rebuke against false teachers, "those long beforehand marked out for destruction" (v. 4), and lovingly appeals to believers to "contend earnestly for the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints" (v. 3). Jude exhorts his readers to "fight for the faith!"

- B. Description of apostates in the present (vv. 8-16)
  - 1. Reputed to be prophets, "filthy dreamers" (v. 8)
  - 2. Revile angelic majesties (vv. 9-10)
  - 3. Reject authority (vv. 11-16) Three OT examples: Cain, Balaam and Korah
    - a. Cain: refused God's way of approach (Gen 4:1-8)
    - b. Balaam: rushed after payment for his evil services (Num 22–24, 31:8, 16)
    - c. Korah: rejected Moses and Aaron's God given authority (Num 16)
  - 4. Revel in the flesh (vv. 12-13) 5 illustrations of apostates from nature
    - a. Hidden reefs in your love feasts, destructive selfish shepherds (v. 12a)
    - b. Clouds without water, no water of life for thirsty souls (v. 12b)
    - c. Autumn trees without fruit, doubly dead, uprooted (v. 12c)
    - d. Wild waves of the sea, casting up their own shame like foam (v. 13a)
    - e. Wandering stars, appear momentarily and vanish into darkness (v. 13b)

#### III. Exhortations for Believers to Avoid Apostates vv. 17-23

- A. Admonition to remember the apostle's teaching (vv. 17-19; 2 Peter 2 and 3)
  - 1. Remember the apostles' warnings (vv. 17-18)
  - 2. Recognize the false teachers (v. 19)
    - a. They cause divisions
    - b. They are worldly-minded
    - c. They are devoid of the Spirit
- B. Appeal to press on in Christian maturity (vv. 20-23)
  - 1. Believers are commanded to press on in Christian maturity (vv. 20-21)
    - a. Build yourselves up in the most holy faith—read the Word (v. 20a)
    - b. Pray in the power of the Holy Spirit—*pray*, *pray*, *pray* (v. 20b)
    - c. Keep yourselves in the love of God (v. 21a; 1 Cor 13)
    - d. Keep watching anxiously for the coming of Jesus Christ (v. 21b)
  - 2. Believers are commanded to reach out to others (v. 22)
    - a. Convince some, weaker Christians who are doubting
    - b. Save others, snatching unbelievers out of the fire
    - c. Have mercy on corrupt, with fear, hating even the garment polluted by the flesh
