

### The Holy One

Intro: Last week we looked at the doctrine of the Trinity. The biblical teaching that there is one God, Yahweh, who is one in essence or substance, but three in personality: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This does not mean three independent Gods existing as One, but three Persons who are co-equal, co-eternal, inseparable, interdependent, and eternally united in one absolute divine Essence and Being (*refer to diagram on the back of your handout*).

This morning we turn our attention to the God's attribute of holiness. Many theologians regard holiness as the very core of God's being, and that which directs all that He does. To put it in another way, *God is inherently holy*.
