Called to be Fishers of Men

Luke 5:1-11

Intro: In this first of two fishing miracles Jesus used to teach His disciples (John 21:1-11), He established His authority and right to call Peter, Andrew, James, and John to fulltime discipleship and evangelism. These disciples responded in faith and obedience: *"they forsook all and followed Him in order to become fishers of men"* (v. 11).

I. Jesus' Ministry in Galilee: Background 5:1-4

- A. His fulfillment of Isaiah 9:1-2
- B. His developing relationship with the disciples

Five callings or challenges to the disciples:

- 1. John 1:35-42—call of the first disciples
- 2. Mark 1 and Matthew 4—call to discipleship
- 3. Luke 5:1-11—*call to become fishers of men*
- 4. Mark 3—commission to lost sheep of Israel
- 5. Matt 28:18-21—Great Commission to all
- C. His teaching of the multitudes (vv. 1-4)

II. Jesus' Ministry to the Disciples (Primarily to Peter) 5:5-11

- A. Faltering faith—Peter's impatience (vv. 5-7)
 - 1. Reaction: "I don't think so . . . "
 - 2. Response: "But because you say so . . . I will do so"
 - 3. Reliance:
 - 4. Result: (vv. 6-7)
- B. Fearful faith Peter's impression (vv. 8-10a)
- C. Fruitful faith Peter's imperative (v. 10b)

III. Interpretation:

Applications:

- 1. Our task is fishing; *God's task is catching*.
- 2. Faith and obedience lead to fruitful man-catching.
- 3. Obedience to the Word of God brings blessing to the worker of God.
- 4. The power of Christ alone will provide success in evangelism—*man-catching*.
- 5. Revelation precedes service: I need to know who God is before I can ever know what I am supposed to do. *Therefore, I must study God's Word to be ready to share my Savior!*
