#### **Paul Praises the Thessalonians** 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10

Intro: In this first chapter Paul commends the Thessalonian believers for their reception of the Gospel of God, and praises them for their "work of faith, labor of love and stead-fastness of hope" (vv. 2-4). He goes on to describe the powerful transformation that the gospel of God—*the good news of life and forgiveness through faith in Jesus Christ*—had produced in them, so that the report of their conversion spread throughout Macedonia, Achai, and in every place (vv. 5-10). The gospel, creates more churches, which in turn spread the gospel further thereby creating more churches, and on and on. *This is God's marvelous plan for ongoing evangelism through local churches.* 

# I. Paul's Opening Salutation and Greeting 1:1

### II. Paul's Thanksgiving for the Thessalonian Believers 1:2-4

- A. Paul always thanks God, and prays for the Thessalonians (v. 2)
- B. Paul constantly (cough) remembers three things about the Thessalonians (v. 3)
  - 1. Their work of faith-belief in and acceptance of Jesus Christ
  - 2. and labor of love-love for God and for one another
  - 3. and steadfastness of hope—looking forward to Jesus' coming
- C. Paul is convinced of God's choice or election of the Thessalonians (v. 4)

## III. Paul Reviews the Thessalonians' Salvation and Subsequent Witness 1:5-10

- A. First, "our Gospel came to you" (v. 5)
  - 1. The Gospel came to the Thessalonians with words.
  - 2. The Gospel came to the Thessalonians in power.
  - 3. The Gospel came to the Thessalonians with deep conviction
  - 4. The Gospel came to the Thessalonians by the Holy Spirit.
- B. Secondly, "you welcomed the message" (v. 6-7)
  - 1. *in spite of much tribulation or severe suffering.*
  - 2. with the joy given by the Holy Spirit.
  - 3. You became imitators of us and of the Lord.
  - 4. So that you became an example (witness) to all (v. 7).
- C. Thirdly, "the Lord's message has sounded forth or rang out from you" (vv. 8-9).
- D. Lastly, the Thessalonian believers were:
  - 1. living a life of service to Christ, and anticipating His sudden return.
  - 2. looking forward to Jesus' coming to deliver them from the wrath of God.

#### Applications:

- 1. As a believer I am promised deliverance from the wrath of God to come! (1:10; 5:9)
- 2. Our Slogan: Live a holy life in anticipation of Jesus' sudden coming for us!
