# Happy Easter

### Resurrection of the Son of God John 20:1-31

Intro: The resurrection of Jesus Christ on Sunday morning (the third day) and His appearances to Mary Magdalene and to His disciples were recorded by John as the conclusive proof/evidence of the deity of Jesus Christ, and to prove He could impart eternal life to all who *believe* and *receive Him* as their personal Savior from sin and the penalty of death.

#### I. Mary Magdalene, and Peter and John Visit the Tomb of Jesus 20:1-10

- A. Mary discovers and reports on the empty tomb (vv. 1-2)
- B. Peter and John discover the empty clothes (vv. 3-10)

## II. Jesus Appears to Mary Magdalene 20:11-18

- A. Mary is confronted by 2 angels in the tomb (vv. 11-13)
- B. Mary is confronted by Jesus outside the tomb (vv. 14-17)
- C. Mary is commissioned to go and tell Jesus' disciples that He has risen from the dead (vv. 17-18)

### III. Jesus Appears to His Disciples, Thomas Absent 20:19-25

- A. Jesus manifests Himself to His disciples (vv. 19-23)
- B. Thomas refuses to *believe* without conclusive evidence (vv. 24-25)

### IV. Jesus Appears to His Disciples, Thomas Present 20:26-29

- A. Jesus challenges Thomas to *believe* in Him (vv. 26-27)
- B. Thomas confesses *faith/belief* in Jesus, "My Lord and my God" (v. 28)

#### V. Conclusion: John's Purpose Statement 20:30-31

John, of all the Gospel writers, records the clearest *purpose statement* for his writing:

20:30—Many other signs therefore Jesus also performed in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; 20:31 but these have been written that you may *believe* that *Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God*; and that *believing* you may have life in His name.

### **Personal Applications**

- 1. Whereas Jesus' death for sin was *a demonstration of God's love for sinners* (John 3:16); Jesus' bodily resurrection was *a demonstration of God's almighty power*!
  - "Jesus Christ was declared to be the Son of God with power by the resurrection from the dead, according to the Spirit of Holiness, He is Jesus Christ our Lord!" (Rom 1:4)
- 2. Jesus' resurrection serves as God's guarantee that all who *believe in Jesus* will likewise be raised to eternal life (1 Cor 15:20-23; 51-58). "Christ was raised from the dead, the first fruits of all those who die in Christ"— referring to all born-again believers (1 Cor 15:20)
- 3. The Gospel or "Good News" about Jesus Christ "Is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also the Greek" (1 Cor 1:16)
- 4. Faith in the risen Lord Jesus is possible apart from actually seeing Jesus (20:8; 29)
