Jesus' Triumphal Entry

John 12:1, 12-19

Intro: As we approach **Easter Sunday**—the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord and Savoir Jesus Christ—I thought it might be good to look at several of the major events that led up to that momentous day. The first event of outstanding significance would be **the Lord Jesus' Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem**. Next Sunday we will examine the Lord Jesus' betrayal, trials, crucifixion, and burial. And then on the following week, **Easter Sunday**, we will celebrate the Lord Jesus' victorious resurrection from the dead.

I. The Significance of Jesus' Triumphal Entry

- A. Question: What do you know about the significance of Jesus' Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem?
- B. Answer: The triumphal entry is our Lord Jesus Christ's official presentation of Himself to the nation Israel as Her Messiah-King.



II. The Story of Jesus' Triumphal Entry John 12:1, 9-19

- A. The Annual Passover Feast 12:1
 - 1. The time—Sunday, "six days before Passover" (v. 1)
 - 2. The multitude—Passover pilgrims (v. 12)
- B. The Prophecies Fulfilled (vv. 12-16)
 - 1. Psalm 118:26—"Hosanna (*Lord save us now*)! Blessed is He who comes in the Name of the LORD, even the King of Israel (Jesus)."
 - 2. Zechariah 9:9—"Fear not, daughter of Zion; Behold your King (Jesus) is coming to you seated on a donkey's colt."
 - 3. Daniel 9:24-26—Jesus offered Himself to the nation of Israel as Her Messiah-King on the tenth of Nisan, that being **April 6, 32 A.D.**
- C. The Mixed Reactions to Jesus' Triumphal Entry (vv. 16-19)
 - 1. The disciples' lack of understanding (v. 16)
 - 2. The multitudes' witness of Jesus' raising of Lazarus (vv. 17-18)
 - 3. The Pharisees' rejection leads to the worlds' reception (v. 19)
