Paul's Parting Words

Acts 20:1-38

Intro: This morning we will travel along with Paul as he initiates the conclusion of his third missionary journey with a whirl-wind Mediterranean tour. He departs Ephesus, revisits the churches he had established in Macedonia and Greece, escapes the Jews' plot to kill him, and issues a final exhortation and blessing to the elders of the church at Ephesus.

 - 3. He had preached an inclusive message (v. 21) Paul preached a simple and yet profound message—God has made salvation available to all who will repent of sin and receive Jesus as Savior. The message has always been the same: repent and believe!

 - 1. *External foes* (vv. 28-29)
