

Crisis In Colossae Introduction to Colossians

Intro: The Book of Colossians belongs to a group of four letters—Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Philemon—commonly designated as the **Prison Epistles**. As you will remember from our study of Philippians, these four Epistles were written by the Apostle Paul during his first Roman imprisonment in (A.D. 60-62). The letter's theme, in light of the rising Gnostic heresy is, *the absolute supremacy and all-sufficiency of Jesus Christ!*
