## Paul Refutes Mysticism and Asceticism

Colossians 2:18-23

**Intro**: Paul continues his refutation of the false teachers at Colossae by defending the Colossians against the *perversions of mysticism* (2:18-19) and *asceticism* (2:20-23). The false teachers were supplanting the Head of the Church, Jesus Christ, the One who supplies spiritual growth.

## III. Paul's Defense Against Mysticism and Asceticism 2:18-23

## A. Paul's Defense Against Mysticism 2:18-19

- 1. Charge to believers (v. 18a)
  - "Don't be robbed of your spiritual rewards in Christ!"
- 2. Characteristics of mysticism (v. 18b-19a)
- a) self-abasement—resulting in a false humility Christ!



We are complete in

- b) worship of angels—intermediate spirits
- c) mystical insights—claiming supernatural visions
- d) based on prideful self-exaltation
- e) not holding fast to the Head, Jesus Christ
- 3. Correction (v. 19)
  - a. "Hold fast to the head, Jesus Christ." There are no shortcuts to true spiritual maturity!
  - b. "Grow in love, devotion, and service to the body of Christ" = fellow believers.

## B. Paul's Defense Against Asceticism 2:20-23

1. Charge to believers (v. 20)

"Since you have died with Christ ..., don't submit to worldly man-made decrees."

- 2. Characteristics of asceticism (vv. 20-23)
  - a. demanded strict obedience to man-made decrees (vv. 20-22)
  - b. disciplined the body, self-abasement and severe treatment of the flesh (v. 23)
  - c. devoid of power over fleshly indulgences (v. 23)
- 3. Correction (v. 23; cf. 3:1-4)

Memory verse: Col. 2:9 "For in Him all the fulness of deity dwells in bodily form."

Rest in Christ and the grace of God that has delivered you from fleshly indulgences.
