

Paul Refutes Deceptive Philosophy

Colossians 2:6-10

Intro: In the next section of Colossians, 2:6-23, Paul moves from the *doctrinal*, which focused on the preeminence of Jesus Christ and His complete provision of reconciliation, to the *polemical*, where he refutes the false teachings being propagated among the Colossians. Paul defends the Colossians against the deadly teachings of philosophy (2:6-10), legalism (2:11-17), mysticism (2:18-19), and asceticism (2:20-23). This morning we only want to deal with the first perversion, *deceptive philosophy*.

I. Paul's Defense Against Deceptive Philosophy 2:6-10

- A. An exhortation to continue in faith (vv. 6-7)
- B. An exhortation to reject deceptive philosophy (v. 8)

Paul's warning draws attention to four characteristics of this dangerously seductive philosophy.

- 1. First, it was deceptive
- 2. Second, it was according to the human traditions of men
- 3. Third, it was propagated by demonic forces
- 4. Forth, it leads to bondage
- C. An exhortation to progress in faith (vv. 9-10)
 - 1. Christ possess all the fulness of deity (v. 9)
 - 2. Christ fills believers (v. 10a)
 - 3. Christ is the head over all rule and authority (v. 10b)
