

#### LIVING THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

"Advancing the Gospel of Christ" Philippians 1:12-30

Intro: The second part of chapter 1 details Paul's **joy** over how his Roman imprisonment was resulting in the advance of the gospel of Christ in that members of Nero's praetorian guard and household were being saved (vv. 12-13), many brethren were preaching Christ without fear (vv. 14-18); and his imprisonment would result in his acquittal for the further advance of the gospel (1:19-26). Paul concludes by exhorting the Philippian believers to employ *single-minded devotion* in their sharing of the gospel, and to strive together with him, if necessary, in his sufferings to advance the gospel of Jesus Christ (1:27-30).

# I. Paul's Imprisonment Resulted in the Advance of the Gospel of Christ 1:12-18

- A. The advance of the gospel among the whole praetorian guard (vv. 12-13)
- B. The advance of the gospel by emboldened brethren (v. 14)
- C. The advance of the gospel from various motives (vv. 15-18)
  - 1 Some preach Christ out of envy and strife (v. 15a)
    - 2 Some *preach Christ out of good will* (v. 15b)
    - 2' The later *preach Christ out of love* (v. 16)
  - 1' The former preach Christ out of selfish ambition (v. 17)
- D. The advance of the gospel causes Paul to rejoice (1:18)

## II. Paul's Imprisonment Viewed as Only Temporary 1:19-26

- A. Paul advances the gospel in life or death (1:19-20)
- B. Paul's acquittal would result in the further advance of the gospel (1:21-26)

## III. Paul's Prescription for Advancing the Gospel of Christ: Single-Minded Devotion 1:27-30

- A. Paul calls for unity—"one spirit with one mind" = *the unified mind* (1:27)
- B. Paul calls for courage in the face of persecution (1:28)
- C. Paul calls for suffering, if necessary, for the advance of the gospel of Christ (1:29-30)

#### Applications:

- 1. Our commission as believers is to grow to love and to share Jesus Christ = gospel—good news.
- 2. Let us **strive together**—"tug of war"—in one spirit with one mind to promote unity in our service!
- 3. It has been granted to us, not only to believe in Christ, but if necessary, to suffer for Him.
