LIVING THE CHRISTIAN LIFE "Living As Citizens of Heaven" Philippians 3:15-21

Intro: Paul exhorts believers: (1) to live mature Christian lives by following the example and pattern set by him and others (vv. 15-17); (2) to avoid the enemies of the cross of Christ, those who "set their minds on earthly things" and pursue a sensual lifestyle (vv. 18-19); and (3) to live as citizens of heaven, eagerly awaiting our Savior "who will transform the body of our humble state into conformity with the body of His glory" (vv. 20-21).

I. Live As Mature Christians 3:15-17

- A. Live as mature Christ-centered believers (v. 15)
- B. Live according to the standard of Christ (v. 16)
- C. Live according to the example of Paul and others (v. 17)

II. Do Not Live As the Enemies of the Cross of Christ 3:18-19

- A. Their determined course: they walk as enemies of Christ (v. 18)
- B. Their description: three identifying characteristics (v. 19)
 - 1. Their god is their belly—sensual and hedonistic in their pursuits and practices
 - 2. Their glory is in their shame—they were prideful and shameless
 - 3. Their minds are set on earthly things—they love the world and the things of the world (Col 2:2, 5, 8; 1 John 2:15-17)
- C. Their destruction (19a; cf. 2 Cor. 5:10; Rev. 20:11-15)

III. Live As Citizens of Heaven, Eagerly Awaiting Our Savior's Return 3:20-21

- A. Live as citizens of heaven (v. 20; 2 Cor. 5:14-21-We are Ambassadors of Christ)
- B. Live in expectation of Christ's return (v. 21; cf. 1 Cor. 15:51-58; 1 Thess. 4:13-18)

Applications:

- 1. Believers are exhorted to live a *maturing* (growing/developing) *Christ-centered life*.
- 2. Believers are exhorted to **NOT** live as enemies of the cross of Christ.
- 3. Believers are exhorted to *live as citizens of heaven*, *eagerly awaiting our Savior "who will transform the body of our humble state into conformity with the body of His glory!*
