

The Miracle Of Christmas

(Matthew 1:18-25; Luke 1:26-56; 2:1-38)

Intro: The miracle of Christmas is the gift of God's Son, Jesus Christ, who came into this world through a virgin conception. The Apostle John tells us in the first chapter of his gospel, that the eternal Word, Jesus Christ, became flesh and dwelt among us, in order to reveal the glory of God the Father to all who receive Him (1:1-14). John goes on to explain that Jesus Christ is "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). This is the Miracle of Christmas. This morning I would like for us to briefly review God's gracious provision of Christ our Savior as recorded in Luke 1 and 2, and Matthew 1. A provision I am calling **the Miracle of Christmas!** Look with me at the Announcements of Christ's Birth, the Advent of Christ our Savior, and the Adoration of Christ Our Savior.
